Track opened after hard slog

South Makirikiri School opened a new, 520 metre fitness track on Friday afternoon; following a three-year project to build the track around the edge of the school's sports field.

Parents and sponsors joined the school to undo the ribbon on the track. with the help of District Mayor Andy Watson, Yr 8 pupil Aleesha Managh and Yr 1 pupil Angus Webb.

Principal Gregg Allan welcomed visitors, after which Hayley Grant, representing Friends of the School, described the project's progression, while acknowledging many hours put in by parents and generous sponsorship provided.

The project was conceived in July 2015 and, by December that year, the trees on the eastern boundary had been removed. Stage 1 - forming of the track began. In March 2016, construction of a boardwalk was followed by a massive community working bee where the track was to be laid. During the holidays, tree slash piles were burnt but a wet winter delayed Stage 2 - building of the stations. Drainage work was required to ensure all-weather use of the track. In March 2017, the south side trees were removed, followed by a huge clean-up effort. The first three stations were built by June when Stage 3, a planting plan, was initiated as part of Arbour Day. The final push for completion was last month.

At last week's ceremony, Hayley Grant said, "Thanks to all the people, businesses and sponsors and those who have donated time, materials and money. South Makirikiri School and community is incredibly grateful for all your support. This has been a true community effort of voluntary time and expertise and the track will be valued by children for years to come." Past students also helped out. The low overall cost of \$27,000 was an indication of the big voluntary contribution.

Hayley especially thanked Tony Hansen and Jono Rayner for their huge contribution in time and effort. Sponsors names are listed on signage at the track.



Young people get Council voice

Young people in Rangitikei will get a voice at the council table from next year.

Rangitikei District Council voted last month to establish a Youth Council for the district.

"It's about young people having a voice and being at the table for decisions that affect them," Council's strategic advisor for youth/ Rangatahi, Nardia Gower, says. "It's also a way for young people to learn how the process works, so they can see that their voice matters and that they can have an influence. It will also help councillors make wellinformed decisions."

Youth councillors will be

selected, rather than elected, to make sure there is a good balance of representation from around the district. As part of RDC's commitment to the Youth Council, all costs including transport and training, will be covered, so there won't be any cost to Youth Council members.

As well as providing a youth perspective on issues facing the district, the Youth Councillors will have the opportunity to get involved with community projects. "The Youth Council will set its own work programme," Gower says. "We'll give them some ideas at the start, but it will be up to them to decide what their priorities

BE SUNSMART THIS SUMMER: SLIP, SLOP, SLAP & WRAP

Protect yourself when you're outside from September to April. And protect yourself all-year-round when you are in the mountains, out on the water or around reflective surfaces like snow and ice.



SLIP ON A SHIRT

Slip on a shirt with long sleeves. Fabrics with a tighter weave and darker colours will give you better protection from the sun.



SLIP INTO THE SHADE

Slip into the shade of an umbrella or a leafy tree. Plan your outdoor activities for early or later in the day when the sun's UV levels are lower.



SLOP ON SUNSCREEN

Slop on plenty of broad-spectrum, water resistant sunscreen of at least SPF 30. Apply 20 minutes before going outside and reapply every two hours and especially after being in water or sweating.



SLAP ON A HAT

Wear a hat with a wide brim or a cap with flaps. More people are sunburnt on the face and neck than any other part of the body.



WRAP ON SUNGLASSES

Choose close fitting, wrap-around style sunglasses. Not all sunglasses protect against UV radiation, so always check the label for the sun protection rating.

THE WATER SAFETY CODE

Now that summer is here, we encourage anyone planning to swim to familiarise themselves with the Water Safety Code's four simple rules.

1. Be prepared

- Learn to swim and survive.
- Set rules for safe play in the water.
- Always use safe and correct equipment and know the weather and water conditions before you get in.

2. Watch out for yourself and others

- Always pay close attention to children you are supervising when in, or near, water.
- Swim with others and in areas where lifeguards are present.

3. Be aware of the dangers

- Enter shallow and unknown water feet first and obey all safety signs & warning flags.
- DO NOT enter the water after drinking alcohol.

4. Know your limits

- Challenge yourself within your physical limits and experience.
- Learn safe ways of rescuing others without putting yourself in danger.
